We are doing some work in Darlington around the voluntary sector working with people and communities to find solutions to things that are not going well.

This is similar to a project in Madrid that a Citizen Network organisation is doing. They are called Fundacion Tuya. We talk to them every month to see if we can learn from each other.

An easy guide to bowel cancer screening


April is bowel cancer awareness month. This easy guide is available to help and support people who may need a bowel cancer screening, or who might need further information about bowel cancer.


Learning Disability Pride

Sage Gateshead Access Register

Sage Gateshead want to make sure that everyone can enjoy going to Sage Gateshead.



They have an access requirement register to help them to make sure that they can find the best seats for you to make Sage accessible.



You can also have a personal assistant or carer attend with you free of charge.

You will need some evidence to get the free ticket for a carer or personal assistant.



The evidence can be

- Front page of DLA (Medium or Higher rate)
- Front page of Attendance Allowance letter (no specific rate required)
- Front page of PIP (no specific rate required)
- Evidence that you are registered severely sight impaired (blind)
- Recognised Assistance Dog ID card
- CredAbility Access Card

Person Centred Reviews and Person Centred Confirm & Challenge Toolkit

Care and Treatment Reviews have shone a light on the care and support of people with a learning disability, autism or both in hospital settings.

But we know many more people live in residential care and supported living or receive adult social care without regular reviews or a 'fresh pair of eyes' looking at their care.

This event, held on the 8th April 2019 in Leeds gave people the opportunity to discuss the barriers and opportunities for Person-Centred Reviews for people with a learning disability, autism or both.

It looked at the issues for people living in the community with residential care/support or supported living.



People said that without a Person-Centred Plan there could be no Person-Centred Review.

A newly developed and piloted **Person Centred Confirm and Challenge Toolkit,** will be available soon.

This will promote individual human rights and will focus on the person from both an individual and a provider perspective.

It will ask important questions based on Human Rights, Equality, Person Centred Support and Quality of Life.



The toolkit will have 5 themes which can be applied to Reviews by both individuals, as a family or with a family by professionals. These are

- Quality of life
- Keeping people safe
- Choice and control
- Support and interventions
- Equitable outcomes

The 8 PERSONAL standards in Care & Treatment Reviews are also used as part of the toolkit.

Living Wage Petition



The Families Lobbying & Advising Sheffield (FLASh) campaign are running a petition.

FLASh are a group of family carers of relatives with Learning Disabilities and/or Autism in Sheffield who are concerned at the state of Social Care, not only in Sheffield, but throughout the UK.

They are petitioning for all employed Care Workers to be paid the Living Wage.



The Living Wage is different to the national minimum wage. It is a higher rate and reflects what it costs to live – to pay for things like rent, electricity and to buy food.

Their goal is to achieve 10,000 signatures.



If they get this they will get a response from the Government.

They also want to provide evidence to inform the forthcoming <u>Green</u> <u>Paper on Social Care</u>.

They feel that Social Care is in a crisis, putting increasing pressure on the National Health Service.



They believe action is needed. They believe that paying Care Workers the Living Wage will create a sustainable workforce.
