Rishi Sunak is now the Prime Minister and the leader of the Conservative Government.

Rishi Sunak took over from Liz Truss who resigned as Prime Minister on the 25th October.

More abuse in Doncaster -

There has been more news this week about the abuse that took place in Doncaster at three residential schools.



The Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel identified a "culture of abuse", including evidence of violence and sexual harm.



There is an investigation by South Yorkshire Police into the abuse.

If we think abuse is happening we must speak up – knowing what our human rights are helps us to speak up.



Article 3 of the Human Rights Act 1998 states we all have:

The right not to be tortured or treated in an inhuman or degrading way
