The Chronicle Live a North East newspaper shared a story this week about 36% of autistic students not finishing their university degrees.



The disability team at the university give students a support plan to meet their needs but their teachers often don't put the right support in place.



Some staff just don't read the plan and a student said "They don't always have the knowledge, understanding or the time to put things in place"



Autistic students want to see clear guidelines and training for all staff as they are sometimes made to feel like if they can't do the work then they should leave university.



The 2010 Equality Act says that disabled students are at a disadvantage and that they should have reasonable adjustments made to remove those barriers.
