What is an ally?

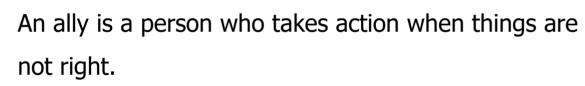
An ally is someone who speaks up when people are not treated right.



Some people are treated differently because of the colour of their skin and this means that they do not get the same opportunities as other people.



For example, some black people might find it harder to get a job or be a victim of hate crime.





This means that they speak up and stand up for people's rights.



An ally is someone who speaks out if they hear someone saying nasty things like racist names or jokes that are racist.
