TV Station in Norway

In Norway there is a TV station run by and for people with a learning disability and autistic people.

It is the first TV station in the world like this.

It is called TV BRA which means TV GOOD in English.

They talk about things that are important to people with a learning disability and autistic people.

They do news reports about:

- big events
- politics
- problems in the world like climate change

The Government in Norway thinks TV BRA is important because it talks about the news in a way that everyone can understand.

The station has 10 reporters around the country.

One of TV BRA's reporters is called Emily. She said: 'When I work here, I have to be very professional. I love being a reporter'.



Sven is also a reporter at TV BRA and he said: "TV BRA is very important. Because we are talking about people who are disabled, and what are our rights in real life."



The boss of TV BRA is called Camilla. She thinks it's important that people with a learning disability and autistic people know about the news.



People can then take part in society more and ask for changes to happen in their lives. It means that people can also understand more about politics and who to vote for.
