**Volunteer of the Year** for a volunteer who makes a difference in their community.




This award was won by **Abigail Garvey** who is a volunteer playworker at Darlington Association on Disability.

The Provider of the Year Award is for a health, social care, support or advocacy organisation that helps people.

**The Going the Extra Mile Award** which is for someone who goes above and beyond to help others.



This was won by **Barbara Topping** from the Newcastle Advisory Group for supporting people with a learning disability, autism and carers in her area.



The Advocacy Organisation of the Year Award honours a group that helps people speak up and be heard.



The award was won by **The People Focused Group** who put lived experience at the centre of everything they do, and every member is both a helper and someone supported.



The final award of the evening, **Outstanding Achievement Award,** went to **Dawn Flockton** a member of Inclusion North.



Dawn empowers women with a learning disability and shares her experience as a lived experience trainer.



There was entertainment including dance from Dance Action Zone Leeds and a disco from Shaun at Ridley Vibes.



We also had guest speakers Denise Bowles, Simon Duffy from the Citizens Network and Carrick Brown.
