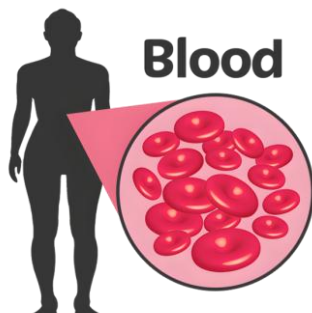

Blood Cancer Awareness Month 2026

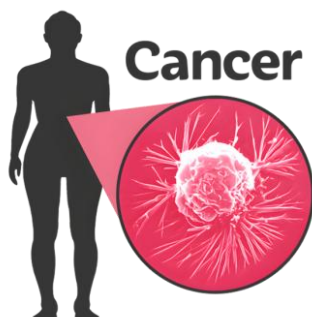


Blood Cancer Awareness Month is held every September to raise awareness of blood cancer, which does not get the same amount of awareness as other cancers.

Changes to Bus Passes For Disabled People.

There are bus passes that let disabled people travel without paying between 9.30 am and 11 pm on weekdays and anytime on weekends.

If disabled people travel at other times, then they pay to travel on the bus.



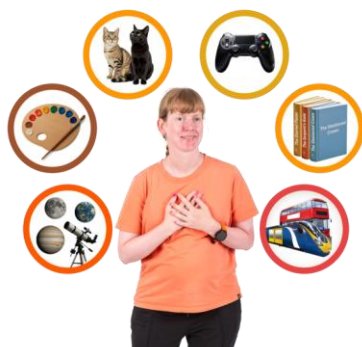
The Prime Minister has announced that the government are changing the rules about using disabled bus passes from 1st April 2027.



This means that from 1st April 2027, disabled people can use their passes at any time, on any day.
